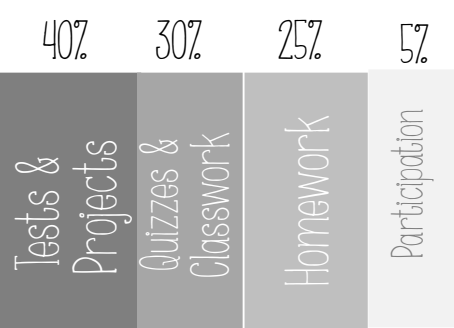
- notebooks

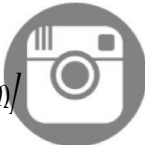


responsibility

This is a tentative syllabus of the year. It could change. Each unit is a month long. Lessons are learned using textbook, lecture, discussion, and other supplementary activities. A vocabulary quiz occurs midway through the unit, and a final assessment is given at the end. A study guide is provided at the start of the unit. Unit projects occur about once a quarter.

homework

Students should read all assigned readings to be prepared for class discussions and regularly review and study vocabulary and INBs to be prepared for assessments.

Most work will be able to be completed in class if students use their time wisely. The exception to this would be any weekly homework or long term projects. Some work may need to be done outside of classes to research or finish final touches.
